DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How valuable is your time? Why is it hard to manage it? What can you do to change that?
2. Talk about a time when you served someone else. How did it benefit the person or group you served? How did it benefit you? Talk about a time when someone served you in a time of need.
3. Jesus washed Judas' feet. Think about that. What does that act of servanthood say about Jesus? What kind of example does that set for us as followers?
4. If every homegroup at Crosswind Church served, how might that change our communities? Talk about some of the things we might accomplish collectively.
5. What can you do to serve others? Think about your abilities, skills, talents, resources, experiences, and temperament. Be as specific as possible.

NEXT STEPS

It's time to serve! When planning your group's service project, finding a time when everyone is available and an opportunity in which everyone can participate may be difficult. But the more your group is able to do together, the richer the experience will be. Make it your goal to find a project that involves as many in your group as possible.
