Icebreakers:

Discussion Questions:

1. The parable of the Good Samaritan is such a well-known story. If you were to list your top stories within the Bible, where would you rank this parable and why?
2. How do you define the term “neighbor”?
3. Read Luke 10:30-37. What’s your favorite part of this story? And tell us, why do you think this parable of Jesus is so well-known throughout churches and culture?
4. Garrett pointed out three steps to be more like the Samaritan within Jesus’ parable: **notice needs, break barriers** and **pay the price**.
 - What is a current need that you notice often?
 - How difficult is it for you to break any barriers after noticing a need?
 - In this parable, the Samaritan paid a price. On a hill called Calvary, Jesus paid a price. What price do you feel like God is asking you to pay?

Next Steps:

- Notice others’ needs.
- Break any barriers to serve that need.
- Remember, often times it comes at a cost; so therefore, pay the price.
